Special Programs & Events:

Parent Café for elementary age parents & caregivers: A welcoming space for parents and caregivers to come together, share experiences, and brainstorm ideas around a focused topic. This workshop is designed for parents of school-aged children and will explore parenting challenges, children's behaviors, resilience, fear, and the realities of everyday life.

Positive Solutions for Families: Parenting young children from 2 to 5 years old can be a challenge.
